# Col. John Voll

A Clermont County Son  
An American Hero

John J. Voll, born May 3, 1922 in Cincinnati

Class of 1940 Goshen High School

Attended Miami University

Taught in Goshen Schools




Enlisted in the Air Corp  
Reserves Aug. 5, 1942

Awarded his wings Jan. 7,  
1944 at age 21






Voll flies lead in this formation of Mustangs over Italy in 1944

Awarded the Silver Star with Oak Leaf Clusters, the Air Medal with 26 Oak Leaf Clusters, and the Service Cross for his "conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity in action"



Flying only 57 combat missions in 7 months, John Voll became the highest scoring ace in the Fifteenth Air Force during World War II.

When the war ended, he was discharged from the military. Captain Voll returned to Goshen where he taught in the Goshen School System for two years.

He was recalled to active duty in October 1948. Voll continued his military service primarily in the Tactical Air Command, but also served in the Korean War, and was the Chief of Tactical Plans for the Seventh Air Force in Vietnam. Colonel Voll was Base Commander of McClellan AFB, California, when he retired in 1974.



Voll died September 12, 1987

Buried in Massachusetts Veterans Administration National Cemetery, Bourne MA


